Emmanuel College, Cambridge.

Three excellent courts, one for Squash Rackets, one for Eton Fives and one for Rugby Fives, have just been opened at Emmanuel College, Cambridge. Designed by Mr. Alan E. Munby, M.A., F.R.I.B.A., the courts have been erected in a corner of the College paddock, where they present an attractive appearance which is quite in keeping with their lovely surroundings. In aspect a single building the Squash Rackets court is in the centre with the Eton and Rugby courts at either end.

The first games in these courts were played on Tuesday afternoon, November 14th, when matches between members of the college, past and present took place. In the Eton Court, Mr. P. W. Wood, the senior tutor of Emmanuel, played with Dr. W. W. Grave against a college pair, while at the same time another college pair were playing Rugby Fives against J. Armitage, who was at Emmanuel College from 1929 to 1932, and J. A. C. Robertson of St. John's College and the present secretary of Cambridge University Rugby Fives Club. Later in the afternoon the Squash court was opened by G. J. V. Weigall, another old Emmanuel man, when he played a number of games against present members of the College. Weigall, as he describes himself, is one of the fittest men in England, so despite his years he still plays a splendid game of Squash Rackets.

All the courts proved, by general consent of the players, to be excellent and present and future members of the College may count themselves extremely fortunate in possessing a court for every kind of game.
