### ***Three Cambridge Fives Players.***

Good Fives players are very often good cricketers, but it is none the less interesting to note that out of the sixteen players who took part in the Oxford and Cambridge Rugby Fives match last season, four, R. de W. K. Winlaw (Cambridge), J. G. W. Davies (Cambridge), R. G. Tindall (Oxford), and E. A. Barlow (Oxford) took part in the 'Varsity Cricket match. A fifth, H. J. H. Lamb (Cam-

bridge) played County Cricket for Northamptonshire, while R. M. Beresford (Cambridge) and N. Cohen (Oxford) are well-known cricketers in a slightly lower class. The three Cambridge cricketers, Winlaw, Davies and Lamb, all took part in County Cricket, for Surrey, Kent and Northampton respectively and did well. Winlaw, next to J. H. Human, was the best batsman Cambridge possessed, Davies was often performing brilliantly in all departments of the game, although all other achievements were overshadowed by his bowling of Bradman for a duck, and Lamb, introduced for the first time to first-class cricket, had an average of seventeen and kept wicket very well.
